Installation Instructions

DESCRIPTION

The Amana® Brand Through-The-Wall (TTW) model's field installed Thermostat Control Conversion Kit is a system to assist to connect with the low 24 voltage thermostat* which controls and operates the main TTW unit.

TERMINAL CONNECTIONS REMOTE THERMOSTAT - CLASS 2

The controls are located under a plastic cover behind the front grille.

1. Remove front grille. Pull the filter out and remove the four grille screws. Pull the grille out from the bottom and lift up from the tabs on the top of the case.





2. Install the conversion board to the conversion board by snapping it in place, Then connect the communication wire that is hanging from the left side of the control board to the the connector on the conversion board. See below.



3. Install the thermostat wires to the conversion board by inserting them into the proper slot and tighten the set screws.



4. Install the conversion board and base in the conversion cover and using the 2 screws supplied secure it to the unit, see below.



5. Route thermostat wiring or front desk control wiring down the side with the power cord.

NOTE: The number 5 dip switch must be in the enabled (UP) position to activate the remote thermostat.



ENERGY MANAGEMENT INPUT (FRONT DESK CONTROL)

The controller can handle a switch signal from remote energy management input, called EM signal or front desk control. Input must be 24 VAC. If system receives a 24 VAC signal, it will turn unit off; otherwise, the unit runs in normal control.

IMPORTANT:

The thermostat connections provide 24 VAC only. If using a digital/electronic wall thermostat, ensure it is compatible with 24 VAC signal. See the installation Instructions for the wall thermostat.

NOTICE:

Damage to a wall thermostat or to the electronics can result from improper connections. Special care must be used in connecting the wires. No line voltage connections should be made to any circuit. Isolate all wires in building from line voltage.
